GENESIS OF THE STANDARD COLLEGE, KONGBA

The college was established in the year **1979**. From a hired building of Madan Mohan High School, Kongba Bazar, the make-shift arrangements continued till the college took its final shape in the year 1981 when it got its present location at Dhobi Lampak, a little distance from Kongba Bazar along Imphal-Yairipok road, with generous donations in cash and kind and contributions of the local people under the supervision of then Governing Body with **Shri Nongmaithem Bijoy Singh** as the first Secretary. The college owns about eight (8) acres of land as college campus and the first Foundation Stone was laid down on **3rd November** of the same year by **Shri Rishang Keising**, the then Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Manipur and **Shri I. Tompok Singh**, the then Hon'ble Education Minister. The college is co-educational having both Arts and Science disciplines.

The college imparts undergraduate courses in different science and arts subjects. From academic session **2021-2022** Four (4 year) degree courses was introduced.

The college had been accredited with **CGPA of 2.25** on seven point scale at **B Grade** by the **NAAC** (National Assessment and Accreditation Council), an autonomous body established by the University Grants Commission) on **September 16, 2016** and reaccredited with CGPA of **2.33** on four point scale at **B Grade** on **October 26, 2022**.

CAMPUS FACILITIES:

LIBRARY: The college has a well-equipped library where students and teachers can have access to text books, reference books, journals, magazines, and other periodicals. Open layout of rooms gives students easy access to reading materials and is backed-up by UGC Network Resource Centre with broadband internet connection. It is computerized using **INFLIBNET's SOUL 2.0 version** and **CCTV (s)** are installed for security measures. The College has a well-stocked library automated with **KOHA software 2.5 network version**. The whole campus has LAN including libraries and e-facilities are available to access e-resources (e-books and e-journals). Internet facility is made available at free of cost to the staff and students. All the staff and students have access to vast e-resources available under N-List of INFLIBNET and e-journals subscribed by the college. The library has 5 functional computers with internet facility out of which 3 are available for use by students and teachers.



ICT FACILITIES: Around 20 computer desktops are available in the Computer Centre to enhance students support for skill development and improve computer knowledge by imparting them to acquire on-job training through Certificate and Advanced Diploma Course in Computer Applications.

WOMEN'S GRIEVANCE CELL (INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC))

It takes care of all complaints of the students inside the campus during college hours. It also takes care of any act of misconduct by a person in authority. The cell is responsible for looking into any complaints filed by students and staff of the college. **Dr. L. Grievance Redressal Procedure :

1. Any women employee or female student will have the right to lodge a complaint concerning any kind of harassment.
2. The Chairperson will transfer the complaint to the Women's Grievance Cell.
3. The Coordinator will convene a meeting on the matter for further necessary action.
4. The complaint will stand dropped if the committee after an enquiry is not able to prove prima-facie an offence of harassment.
5. Any irrational complaint lodged shall be viewed seriously by the Cell and it shall have the right to decide upon the course of action thereafter.

EXAMINATION CELL:

The overall aim of Examination cell committee is to co-ordinate and conduct of Mid-term assessments, End examinations, University end examinations, Practical examinations, to refer cases of malpractice in the examination to the Principal for necessary action, to process the exam remuneration bills on time, to prepare course/program wise distribution of pass percentage and submit the same to the Principal of the college.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC):

The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system in pursuance of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) guidelines for its action plan for performance evaluation, assessment & accreditation & quality up-gradation of institutions of higher education. Overall supervision relating to academic and infrastructure augmentation for obtaining higher grade from NAAC accreditation and assessment is done by a decision of IQAC with due consultation of the HODs and other stakeholders regularly. The 2nd Cycle of NAAC has endowed the College with **B-Grade** (CGPA-2.33) in 2022. **Dr. N. Chandrashekhar Singh**, HOD and Assistant Professor, Department of Geography is the IQAC Co-ordinator of the college.

ALL INDIA SURVEY OF HIGHER EDUCATION (AISHE):

To portray the status of higher education in the country, Ministry of Education has endeavoured to conduct an annual web-based **All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE)** since 2010-11. The survey covers all the Institutions in the country engaged in imparting of higher education. Data is being collected on several parameters such as teachers, student enrolment, programmes, examination results, education finance, infrastructure.

Indicators of educational development such as Institution Density, Gross Enrolment Ratio, Pupil-teacher ratio, Gender Parity Index, Per Student Expenditure will also be calculated from the data collected through AISHE. These are useful in making informed policy decisions and research for development of education sector.

NATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL RANKING FRAMEWORK (NIRF):

The **National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)** was approved by the **MHRD** and launched by Honourable Minister of Human Resource Development on **29th September 2015**. This framework outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. The parameters broadly cover "Teaching, Learning and Resources," "Research and Professional Practices," "Graduation Outcomes," "Outreach and Inclusivity," and "Perception".

Dr. N. Chandrashekhar, HOD and Assistant Professor, Department of Geography is the **Nodal Officer** of NIRF. The NIRF Code of Standard College is **IR-C-C-9426**.

RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA):

The **Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)** is the central government's contribution to further the promise held by the rich expanse of India's state universities. The country's future lies in empowering these campuses with all that it takes to enhance learning, better research and promote innovation. A centrally sponsored scheme, RUSA understands that sometimes the most important lessons of life are learnt outside the classroom. So whether it is upgrading libraries or computer laboratories, promoting autonomous colleges or clubbing them to consolidate their strength and forming cluster universities, this programme realizes that every institution holds the power to enrich lives through top-class education. At present **Dr. N. Chandrashekhar**, HOD and Assistant Professor, Department of Geography is the **Nodal Officer** of RUSA.

INSTITUTIONAL LEVEL BIOTECH HUB:

The college has also a **BioTech Hub** sponsored by **Department of Biotechnology, Government of India** to provide basic Biotechnology Infrastructure and research facility for the students, faculties, researchers of individual institutions as well as nearby institutions, to organise trainings / workshops for teachers and students.

The project is functioning since **2013** under the co-ordinator, **Dr. A. Premila Devi**, **HOD & Assistant Professor**, Department of Botany.

Institutional Level Biotech-hub is a “Human Resource Development and Infrastructure development” project sponsored by **Department of Biotechnology, Government of India**. After completion of 3 years, it was again extended for another 2 years.

Since inception of the Biotech Hub Department of Standard college many scientific equipments were also procured for performance of different experiments related to research as well as B.Sc. students' practical classes. In addition, as part of the project, “**Hands on training programme** on different topics like plant tissue culture, Bioinstrumentation, microbiology and biochemistry techniques were conducted for B.Sc. and biological science students for our college and also students from other colleges/Schools many outreach programmes were also conducted. The project was completed in 2018.

ADD-ON COURSES & COLLABORATION:

The institution had introduced two Add-on Courses:

1. **Certificate, Diploma & Advanced Diploma Course** on ICT (UGC Sponsored)
2. **Food Processing & Preservation (RUSA sponsored)**. Collaborative works as on-job training programme. Food Processing is carried out in collaboration with **MEIRA Food Industry, Manipur**.

All examinations are conducted by Manipur University.

P.M. VISHWAKARMA SCHEMES

The P.M. Vishwakarma Scheme was introduced at Standard College on October 2024 as a training partner and training center. It is funded by the **National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC)**. The training center offers three trades: **washerman (dobi)**, **traditional basket making** and **tailoring**. To date, approximately **600 trainees** have successfully completed the program and obtained certifications. The scheme is valid until 2028.

The single point of contact (SPOC) for the scheme is **A. Narendra Singh**, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science.

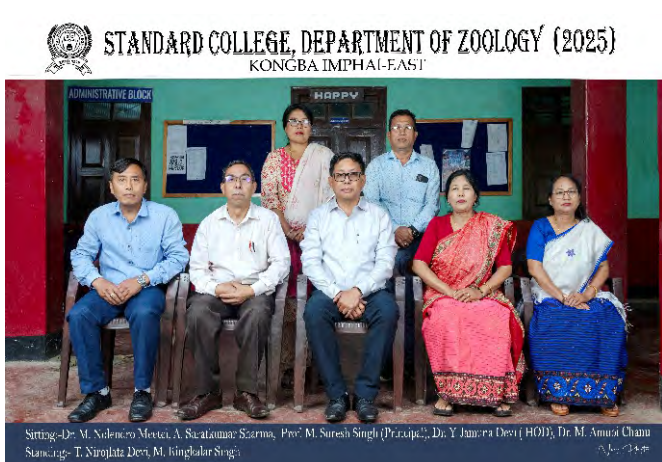
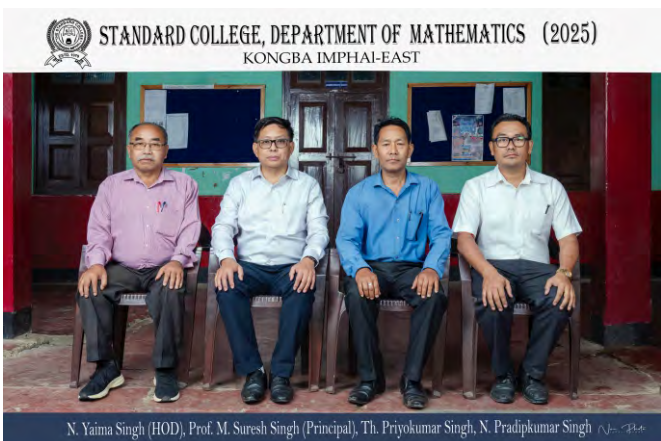

1. BACHELOR OF ARTS (B.A.) 2. BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (B.Sc.)

FOUR YEAR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME IN B.A/B.SC. (HONOURS)

The undergraduate academic programme governed by Manipur University's Ordinance dated 26/10/2021 is of four years duration with multiple exit options. The curriculum for the 4-years is based on LOCF-CBCS system of the UGC with value addition courses. In the new LOCF-CBCS based programme, the course structure for 4-years **B.A. / B.Sc. (Honours)** consist of **18 Core Courses / papers, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 4 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses, 6 Generic Electives (GEC) Courses** and some **Value Addition Courses (VAC) with a minimum of 182 Credits**

- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 1st Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-1 & 2), 1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC-1) (English/MIL), 1 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC-I) and 2 Value Addition Courses (VAC-1 & 2); *Altogether 6 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 2nd Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-3 & 4), 1 Course in AECC-2 (Environmental Studies), 1 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC-II), and 2 Value Addition Courses (VAC-3 & 4). *Altogether 6 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 3rd Semester:** 3 Core Courses (CC-5,6 & 7), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-1), and 1 Value Addition Course (VAC-5). *All together 5 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 4th Semester:** 3 Core Courses (CC-8,9&10), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-2), and 1 Value Addition Course (VAC-6). *Altogether 5 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 5th Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-11 & 12), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-3), 1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE-1), and 1 Value Addition Course (VAC-7). *Altogether 5 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 6th Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-13 & 14), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-4), 1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE-2), and 1 Value Addition Course (VAC-8). *Altogether 5 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 7th Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-15 & 16), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-5), 1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE-3). *Altogether 4 papers.*
- **B.A./B.Sc. (Honours) 8th Semester:** 2 Core Courses (CC-17 & 18), 1 Generic Elective Course (GEC-6), 1 Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE-6). *Altogether 4 papers.*

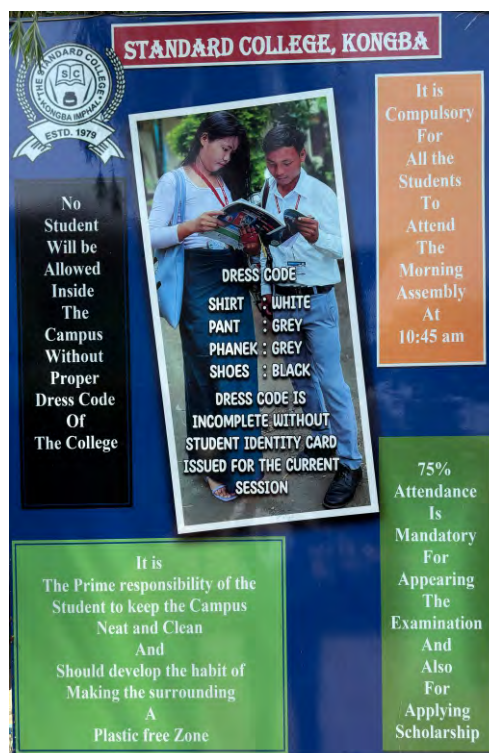
PRESCRIBED CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE COLLEGE:
